# How to Make Collagraph Prints with Cardboard









#### Materials:

- Flat piece of cardboard the size of a piece of paper
- Extra cardboard for cutting out shapes
- Scissors
- Glue
- Wide paintbrush
- Tempera (washable) or acrylic paint
- White paper

#### Steps:

- 1. Cut out shapes from your extra cardboard.
- 2. Arrange cardboard shapes on the flat piece of cardboard.
- 3. Glue down shapes onto the cardboard and let dry.
- 4. Use your chosen paint colors to paint all over the raised parts of the cardboard.
- 5. Paint should not be too thick, but the cardboard will absorb some of it, so you will need to use a lot.
- 6. Place the white paper on top of the painted cardboard.
- 7. Flip it over so the paper is on the table and press all over.
- 8. Peel of the paper to see your design.

## What is a Collagraph?

A collagraph is an additive printmaking method where the printing surface is built up. It is created by gluing various materials and textures to a support surface.
